



MATHS STUDENT SELECTED TO REPRESENT THE UK!

In early April, A Level student, Sean Moss attended the International Maths Olympiad (IMO) training camp at Trinity College Cambridge, run by the British Maths Olympiad Committee.

Sean, who is in his second, highly successful year at Havering Sixth Form College, has recently been offered a place at Trinity College Cambridge where he will study Mathematics.

Following the IMO training camp, the College is delighted that Sean has been selected as one of the nine members of the British squad for the IMO. From this squad, a team of six will be chosen, with three reserves. The IMO takes place this year in Bremen, Germany between the 10th and the 22nd July. The Team Leader is Dr Geoff Smith of the University of Bath and the Deputy Leader is Dr Vesna Kadelburg of Mander Portman Woodward, Cambridge.

In addition, the UK has been invited, as a guest nation, to send a team to the Balkan Mathematical Olympiad in Kragujevac, Serbia, from the 28th April to the 4th May. The Team Leader for this event will be Dr Vesna Kadelburg of Mander Portman Woodward, Cambridge and the Deputy Leader is Robin Bhattacharyya of Loughborough Grammar School. Sean is one of the six students chosen for this.

Principal, Paul Wakeling, offered Sean his sincere congratulations on being selected to represent his country, not once but twice! "This is a phenomenal achievement. Over the past two years, Sean has consistently demonstrated his outstanding mathematical talents, his resilience and pursuit of excellence. We wish him the best of luck in both events."
