



British Maths Olympiad student invited to Cambridge training camp!

Havering Sixth Form College student Sean Moss has been invited to the Trinity College Cambridge International Mathematical Olympiad training camp at the start of April.

Sean received the invite, along with congratulations from Dr G C Smith, BMO chair and IMO team leader, on the strength of his BMO second round paper.

Following intensive preparation for the tough second round of this prestigious competition, Sean scored 32 out of 40 in the three and a half hour exam, placing him **ninth** in the whole country. This is an outstanding result, and is a testament to Sean's passion for mathematics, his enjoyment of the subject, and his desire to continually develop his mathematical skills, knowledge and understanding.

Sean, who is still only 17, is in his second year at Havering Sixth Form College. Last year, Sean achieved an amazing 4 A grades at AS as well as a grade A in A Level Spanish! Recently he was part of a team that came third in the East London Final of the Senior Team Maths Challenge at Queen Mary University of London.

Sean has recently received an offer of a place to study Mathematics at Trinity College Cambridge in September. This is where the five day residential training session will also take place.

Principal Paul Wakeling, congratulated Sean on behalf of all the students and staff at the College. "We are very proud of Sean's achievements. The fact that he has been offered a place at Cambridge speaks for itself. He has proved himself to be an outstanding mathematician and a real credit to the College."
