



SEAN FLIES FLAG FOR UK MATHS!

Upminster student, Sean Moss, attended the Maths Olympiad training camp at Oundle School, Peterborough between the 23rd - 27th May. Based on his performance there, he has been selected as one of the six members of the British team who will compete in the 50th International Mathematical Olympiad to be held in Bremen, Germany from 10th -22nd July.

The competition attracts the most talented young mathematicians from all over the world. The Team Leader for this year's event is Dr Geoff Smith of the University of Bath and the Deputy Leader is Dr Vesna Kadelburg of Mander Portman Woodward, Cambridge.

Sean has only recently returned from Kragujevac, Serbia where he achieved a bronze medal in the Balkan Mathematical Olympiad. Sean was one of the six members of the team representing the UK.

Sean's Maths teacher, Damian Rogan, comments: 'Sean has put in a huge amount of work over the last two years to achieve this success, and it is richly deserved. He is, without doubt, one of the most gifted mathematicians of his age in the whole country.'

Sean is in his second year at Havering Sixth Form College. Last year, Sean achieved an amazing 4 A grades at AS as well as an A grade in A Level Spanish! Sean has recently received an offer of a place to study Mathematics at Trinity College Cambridge in September.
