



BTEC Extended Diploma and National Diploma in Travel and Tourism

BTEC Extended Diploma in Travel and Tourism equivalent to three A Levels.

BTEC National Diploma in Travel and Tourism equivalent to two A Levels.

Students can combine the National Diploma with an additional A Level of their choice.

Both courses run for two years.

These courses provide you with a work-related introduction to the travel and tourism industry. You will learn about the many opportunities in travel and tourism and gain an understanding of the value of the industry locally, nationally and internationally. You may also do the Travel Training Awards (additional travel industry qualification) and Spanish ASSET as additional qualifications to enhance your job prospects.

Requirements:

The College minimum to start an advanced level course is one grade B and four grade Cs at GCSE. Students wishing to undertake this course require grade C or above in GCSE English Language. The student will also be expected to meet the Average Points Score for this subject.

This course will focus on:

- the travel and tourism industry and how this dynamic sector functions;
- explore the business of travel and tourism – analysing aims and objectives of the range of different companies;
- customer service in travel and tourism;
- the UK as a travel destination and the impact tourism has on the economy;
- research worldwide travel destinations;
- sustainable tourism development and who is responsible; and
- event planning in an ever changing world.

You can expect to:

- take part in presentations and role plays;
- organise events;
- complete written assignments;
- develop display boards;
- visit and study local attractions and destinations;
- attend a work placement in the industry and develop your skills for employment;
- at Havering Sixth Form College we also offer The Travel Academy. This is a suite of courses leading to qualifications such as Air Fares and Ticketing, Air Cabin Crew, Airline Grooming and Presentation, Airline Health and Safety, Spanish ASSET and Computerised Reservations Systems. Some assessments for the Airline qualification will be held in a mock aircraft requiring students to simulate airline skills and knowledge.

Method of assessment:

Assessment is by coursework portfolio. The BTEC National Diploma is comprised of twelve units and the BTEC

Extended Diploma is comprised of eighteen units. There will be some airline assessments taken under test conditions.

Progression:

This course provides the opportunity to progress to Higher Education such as HND or degree programmes in Tourism or follow pathways into employment within one of the many areas of the travel and tourism industry, such as airlines, tour operations, visitor attractions, tourism development, travel agencies, holiday representatives and event management.

What can you do after the course?

Some of our previous students are now in employment including:

- air cabin crew with Easyjet;
- London City Airport;
- Thomas Cook;
- conference and events at West Ham United;
- Neilson ski representative;
- Eurocamp; and
- summer jobs at: Claridges Hotel, The Four Seasons Canary Wharf, The Berkeley Hotel and The Ritz.

Many students go on to university to study Tourism further for example University of Surrey with one year placement in San Francisco, University of Hertfordshire and University of Sussex.

Other information:

You will be expected to take part in educational visits in the UK with the possibility of an overseas residential visit.

In 2009, there was 100% student achievement with the majority of students achieving Merit or Distinction. A number of students progressed on to university to study Tourism Management and into employment in the travel industry.
