



## GCSE Photography

*Students will combine this course with up to five other GCSEs.*

Photography is about developing the ability to see things in a new and interesting way and translating visual ideas into successful outcomes, through a combination of skill and imagination.

### **Requirements:**

The College minimum to start a GCSE course is four GCSEs at grade D or above. Previous experience in photography is not required, although an art subject at GCSE would be beneficial.

### **This subject will focus on:**

- practical photography work;
- researching a range of different photographers; and
- presenting work to a high standard, including an end of year exhibition.

### **You can expect to:**

- have a thorough induction at the start of the course;
- learn to use an SLR camera;
- visit different locations within Essex and London;
- take both black and white and colour films;
- develop black and white films;
- print photographs in the darkroom;
- experiment with a range of different creative techniques, such as solarization, contacts and toning;
- study the work of photographers;
- annotate and evaluate; and
- present work ready for exhibition.

### **Method of assessment:**

Assessment is by coursework and practical examination.

### **Progression:**

You may be able to progress on to AS level courses or BTEC National Certificate/Diploma programmes.

### **Other Information:**

A basic range of media and materials will be provided.

Students will need to purchase a range of other art materials in order to do further work outside of the lesson. They will be advised of the requirements on entry to the course. Trips and visits to London and abroad are arranged as part of the course.

### **Success at Havering Sixth Form College:**
