		theoretical understanding in order to support their harmony / composition / arranging work at advanced level. A target grade Theory Examination (Associated Board) will be set for each student. The course is a single lesson each week and it is important that you sign up for this course at enrolment in September. Work will cover all the main areas including: Key and Time Signatures, Rhythm Work, Clefs, Transposition, Melody Writing, Cadences and Harmony as well as some General Music Knowledge.	
Music	Brass Ensemble	Brass players can enjoy playing in a small ensemble (one to a part) in a variety of styles from Renaissance to Jazz	Jonathan Venner
Music	Big Band	Jazz, funk and Latin music ranging from the big band era to the present day. Instrumentalists include: saxophones, trumpets and trombones. (Grade 5+ standard). Rhythm section players also required, comprising: piano, bass guitar or double bass, drum kit, percussion. Experience of playing this style of music preferred, but not necessary. Music	Rock Bands	This is an opportunity for students to form their own Rock Band. Sessions will initially take the form of auditions, and then a programme of rehearsal times will be set up. In addition to preparing for performance, groups will be encouraged to support Music Technology students with their recordings. Music	String Ensemble	For all string players where they can develop their ensemble playing.	Jonathan Venner
Music	Vocal Workshop	All keen singers are invited to join this vocal group as part of their programme. Lessons in technique and voice development will be offered alongside a varied programme of music making in various styles. You do not have to read music but be able to pitch notes fairly accurately. Most important is a commitment to the rehearsals that culminate in two concert performances during the year.  All students receiving individual vocal tuition must attend this group. Performing Arts, Music and Drama students should take this opportunity to develop their aural/vocal skills as well as those of you who just enjoy singing.
